

REUNION 2025 & COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT




HONOURING LEGACY & EXCELLENCE






MAY 2025


MRS JEANETTE FINNIE



- Calvin Savage (OC 2011) starred in Major League Cricket in the USA, earning Player of the Match for the Texas Super Kings.




ENDURANCE, COURAGE & INSPIRATION


Leadership & College Milestones




COLLEGE CONNECT & COMMUNITY GROWTH

Induction 2025 – Welcoming the Class of 2025 into the Brotherhood

The Class of 2025 Induction Ceremony was the defining highlight of the month and one of the most significant events on the MCOBA calendar. The evening marked the official transition of the Matrics from Maritzburg College scholars to Old Collegians, welcoming them into a lifelong brotherhood.

Held on the historic campus and steeped in tradition, the ceremony brought together families, Old Collegians, staff and friends to witness the passing of the torch from one generation to the next. Each young man was formally welcomed into the MCOBA by MCOBA President, Mr Jon Hoatson (OC 1998) and presented with his Old Collegians tie, a powerful symbol of belonging, continuity and connection. Many of these ties were sponsored by Old Collegians, reinforcing mentorship and intergenerational bonds.

In keeping with tradition, the Head Prefect of 2025 received his Old Collegians blazer, symbolising both the conclusion of his school journey and the beginning of his place among generations of Old Boys.

The ceremony was enriched by heartfelt reflections. Valedictorian Justin Steyn addressed the audience with sincerity and authenticity, speaking of gratitude, character and the enduring bonds forged "within these walls."
